Papers must be submitted to the *Journal* both via e-mail and on paper. Submissions should not exceed a total length of 10,000 words (including notes) for papers, and 1,500 for reviews. Papers must include an abstract of around 150 words and a bibliography.

The corresponding author (or first named) will receive proofs of the paper only via e-mail (pdf file) and is asked to send corrections only on paper to the editors within two weeks.
